The opportunity: Work study students are needed now to work at MassVOTE, a nonpartisan civic education organization.

The organization: Does every vote count in America? Not unless someone is there to fight to make sure. MassVOTE is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization that watchdogs the integrity of elections, fights for policy changes to make democracy accessible to voters, and works to make sure that everyone has an opportunity to participate.

The office: MassVOTE's offices are located in downtown Boston, close to all 4 T lines, steps from City Hall and the State House. Staff members are professional and diverse. They work hard and bring creativity, respect, and a good sense of humor to the job. Interns should do the same.

The commitment: Work study students are asked to commit at least 10 hours a week for at least 10 weeks. All work study students are mentored and supported in return for their work. Longer and more intensive commitments are preferred, since students are responsible for substantive projects, it allows them to learn more skills, and create better results.

The work: Students may do research, grassroots organizing, State House and City Hall advocacy, and direct voter contact. Each student is given a specific project to work on over the course of the semester, and paired with a staff supervisor.

Compensation: Students will be paid \$9/hr if they have work study funds available.
